

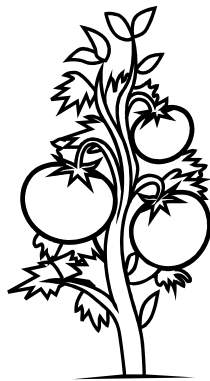
Tarremahtoes are here again!

Tomato Season 2009

- ∞ **Allen's Early** This early fruiting bush type tom is great for pots or containers, red small-medium sized fruit, (60 days) Merry Christmas!
- ∞ **Anna Russian** Glory, what a tomato! This fruity beauty is an heirloom staking variety with sparse foliage, large red, heart-shaped fruit with harvest in 65-70 days.
- ∞ **Black Cherry** These small black cherry charmers have a knock your socks off fabulous flavour. Early harvest (64 days) and the yield goes on and on. They are marvellous in salads, or straight from the vine with that January sun on your back...
- ∞ **Black Russian** This magnificent black heirloom tomato is a real crowd-pleaser, a masterpiece of tomato matter. Sweet, round red fruit with purple blush and dark chocolate-red flesh. It is a marvellous looking, superbly flavoured, med-large heirloom. (77 days)
- ∞ **Black Zebra** Medium sized, black, heirloom. This tomato is a regular overachiever. It is fabulous in the kitchen, beautiful eating texture and lovely looking. Fruit is small with deep red/black colour and dark green stripes. (85 days).
- ∞ **Daydream** Dream a tomato dream: red round and perfect. This is a marvellous medium-large sized, climbing, heirloom tomato with a high yield and taste beyond compare.
- ∞ **Duetscher Fleiss** Small, red heirloom bush tomato. Fruit is 3-4cm in trusses of 6. Great for cool climate growing. (105 days)
- ∞ **Grosse Lisse** We know lots of gardeners who grow just one variety and THIS IS IT. No two ways about it, it is a peerless wondertom. Abundant fruit (16kg /plant) produced over a long time. Beautiful, classic heirloom. Large and smooth by name, large and smooth by nature.(85-105 days)
- ∞ **Harbinger** This top-hole thin-skinned tomato is a medium red, heirloom staking variety. Harvest is early, bountiful and delicious. We hear it's a rool bewdy.
- ∞ **Jaune Flamme** First in is best dressed for Jaune flamme. This superb apricot shaped tomato is an heirloom loved by the French for its exquisite fruity flavour. It is marvellous dried, unbeatable raw and famous in sauce. Deep orange colour (retained in cooking) and beautiful from root to fruit. Gourmands queue nicely please. (90 days)
- ∞ **June Pink** This terrific tom is the cat's meow. Gorgeous rose pink, medium-sized heirloom staking tom. Fruits early in clusters, marvellous in salads or sauces. Thumbs up for canning, good in cool conditions, produces over a long period.(68 days) Well!
- ∞ **Kotlas** Small, red, extra early, heirloom tom (59 days). Experienced growers know how well this is suited to Tasmania. This extra well-mannered and punctual good performer deserves his excellent reputation and faithful fans.
- ∞ **Longkeeper** Medium sized and bitey red climber with remarkable storing properties. Pick before fully ripe and the fruit will keep for an amazing 3 months! (70 days)
- ∞ **Mortgage Lifter**. Mind your backs ladies and gents! This high yielding, bright red, heirloom whopper tom bears fruit to a stunning 1500g. Developed in the 1930s from beefsteak varieties, this very popular variety trumps on taste and yield (16kg/ plant).We suggest a hot house/ garden for this giant-and as for sharing your surplus-pick me! (79days)
- ∞ **Orange Cherry**. Tall vigorous climber with magnificent yields of round orange fruits. (55-65days) Great for cool spots...hot spots any spot you've got...don't miss this one.

- ∞ **Oregon Spring** This very well organised tomato has fans in high places. A noble plant, this compact grower is a real favourite for short season gardeners. It has a full tomato flavour with a nearly seedless red, juicy fruit- medium to large (59 days)
- ∞ **Oxheart Red** Large red oxheart heirloom with high yields. This old garden favourite grows well in cool areas, heavy feeder, but FLAVOUR! A solid tom with thick flesh has a magnificent taste, a single slice for a sandwich..in fact...biff the bread and love that tomato. Oxheart fans won't be convinced onto any other. (80-95 days)
- ∞ **Red Fig** This charming, small, pear-shaped tomato (to 4cm) is a rare American heirloom. Climber and heavy producer, apparently so called because fruit used to be dried and stored for winter use as a substitute for figs. Aw...How Tomantic! (85 days)
- ∞ **Red Roma** ahh the trusty roma tom. Super popular plum variety, faithful fruiter, dense fleshy fruit, long producer. Great for canning and sauce. Versatile and loyal variety.
- ∞ **Rouge de Marmande** Large red, early-maturing beefsteak heirloom. It grows as a vigorous bush, but is suited to staking. It fruits under cooler conditions than many tomato varieties. A triumph in flavour, Marmande is an absolute classic and well-loved all-rounder. It is Large, fleshy and marvellous, roast-me-whole tomato, packed with experience. Take two!
- ∞ **Silver Fir** Medium-large, round orange-red fabulously flavoured fruits. Good zingy flavour, early fruit (75 days). Wonderful lacy silver-grey leaves on an eye-catching bush plant. (Testimonial: First variety to ripen in a certain Pelverata garden last year!)
- ∞ **Taxi** Cool tolerant and early bearing (65-70 days) large, globular yellow/ orange bush tomato. This tomato is a determined little sort, bears good fruit with very nice flavour.
- ∞ **Tigerella** Very high yielding well-loved salad tom. It bears attractive and tasty medium-sized, stripy red/ orange fruit in abundance. Tigerella is a famously strong producer (20 kg/ plant) and does very well in Tassie. Feed an army with Tigerella. (73days)
- ∞ **Tiny Tim** This perky little punter is an itsy bitsy red bush tomato with 'winner' all over it. It is very high yielding with picking from 45 days. The yield goes on and on and on. It has a mouth-watering flavour, beautiful for salads. Your children will love them.
- ∞ **Tommy Toe** There'll be a stampede for the Tommy toe- and rightly so. This dazzling morsel is an heirloom tomato with a very becoming small tom size and high yield over several months Embrace the winner within- you can't go wrong with Tommy Toe. Staking variety, award winning top taste. (73 days)
- ∞ **Yellow Broad Ripple Currant** The piccolo of the tomato orchestra this delightful, small, yellow, high-yielding heirloom is so prolific you'll be eating them breakfast, lunch and dinner. Nearly 4000 fruits per happy plant, this variety is tiny on size, titan on taste. Quiver at this: you can bake the trusses whole! It yields over months. ("I left them in the end, I got fed up picking them" *anon, W. Hobart*) (77days)
- ∞ **Yellow Pear**. What a little sweetie this tomato is. Produces clusters of small yellow pear shaped fruit. Perfect raw, cooked or preserved. Vigorous and heavy bearing, heirloom variety, requires staking (70 days)

Tomatoes are individually potted (7.5x10cm pots) Cost \$2 each. Orders must be received by 25.9
